Although $D z$. power hes found no unusuat health protlems in this group, we are disturbed by the froduency of borderline elevated liver function. Dr. Fowor talked with Haynestoro'a plant doctor about Defr expasurc and liver function results. Their doctor said they rarely hofe an elevated 1 iver fonction ain suggested the laboriatory we use might be giving high regulte. The faynesboro doctor also comunted ke should not be having a problem in Butacites based on the relatively lov levels of DMF in the urine test.

As the opportunity pressnt? itself, Dr. Fower plans to take doplicato fapleles on some of our borderline cases and have them run at two different labs. He"ll ferp you advined of the results.

A review of the medical recoris of eleven operators and eighteen laboratorians who have hard long-term oxpesure to c-8 was undertaken.

As you would anticipate, a ureat variety of illnegeses and physical findings were found: but 3 do not believe any of these are caused bi exposure to $\mathrm{C}-8$. Sowe of the illnesses found are two heart attacks and fivo ongloyees tith high blood pressure. One questionable case of sejs cancer was found during an employee's physical examination in 1976. so further mention of this possible tumor could be fonnd.

Kinor elevations of many blood testa did oceur in larger-than-anticipated numbers and are 1 isted soparately. With the exception of one person, all of the clevitlons wotn borderline and not indicatfve of disease. One of the ilver function tests (SGOT) is most frequently elevated in the operator group. मowever, no liver diseases were fo:nnd. kany of the laboratorians also work with Perclene, which is a known hepatatoxin.

In conclusion, I could find no unusual health problems occurring in the qroup of people studied, with the exception of borderline elevation of liver function tests. since it has been previously determined that $C-8$ is an heeatatoxin, it is possible that $C-8$ may be causing very minimal, and certainly not clinically apparent. toxic effectes to tho liver. Bocause the total number of records reviewed is small (3i), I do not belleve any findings of this atudy are statistically valid.
